S.P.A.N. = SEASONS FOR PEACE AND NONVIOLENCE

A Season for Humane Service is 1 of 4 Annual "Seasons for Peace and Nonviolence".

As a result of a decade of sustained strategic action, the Gandhi King Season for Nonviolence has helped to launch a new model for omni-local, spiritually-based peace governance, igniting a fusion of new communities and initiatives. "S.P.A.N. the Next Decade" celebrates four "Seasons" each year; groups may choose to participate in every season, specific seasons, or focus on one season as a theme for their permanent work.



<u>A Season for Nonviolence:</u> <u>January 30 - April 4</u>

A Season for Nonviolence is a national 64-day educational, media, and grassroots campaign dedicated to demonstrating hat

non-violence is a powerful way to heal, transform, and empower our lives and our communities.



A Season for the Earth: April - June

Season for the Earth is devoted to focusing our consciousness-in-action

so we are better able to heal, nurture and transform the environment-- an undertaking now vital beyond description.



A Season for Humane Service: June - August

A Season for Humane Service is all about compassionate service and giving. We assure you that your

participation in these humanitarian projects will contribute to "A World of Good".

WHAT DOES A SEASON FOR HUMANE SERVICE TASK FORCE DO?

The primary role of the local task force is to identify and connect organizations and individuals that are engaged in work promoting human rights, equality, and humanitarian aid in their city.

These organizations and individuals will describe a specific project, program, or initiative that emphasizes service to others. Featuring these programs and projects during the Season will build trust and enthusiasm within your community.

The Task Force Leader(s) will coordinate activities such as:

- Organize meetings
- Coordinate task force volunteers and their activities
- Communicate and transfer information to AGNT
- Represent your city on national steering committee
- Coordinate and plan local events
- Work with local media

Local task forces work to profile the organizations and individuals in their city who reflect the core principles of peace and equality. This will eventually create a "map" of "what's working."



HOW DO I BEGIN?

Call a meeting of key people in your church, spiritual community, or organization.

These would include, ministers and executive assistants, program directors, staff, core volunteers, members. Use the website to prepare handouts and discussion points. The online resources listed are hand-picked to bring you to the best resources available as quickly and easily as possible. We have already done the extensive research for you, so take advantage of this opportunity. Schedule a brief meeting or conference call to determine if the group wants to go further. <u>USE THE DISCUSSION QUESTIONS AT THIS LINK TO FACILITATE A DIALOGUE</u>.

Your task Force will consist roughly of the following constituents:

- A. An organization in your community demonstrating commitment and leadership in this area
- B. Task Force Coordinator You, or someone within your organization
- C. Core group of volunteers to serve as local Steering Committee: SUGGESTIONS
 - Administrative, database, records, phone
 - Person who knows local media
 - Event planner
 - Meeting facilitator
 - Funding and promotion
 - Graphics and artwork; printing services
- D. 2nd "ring" of volunteers from community, to assist in:
 - Mailings
 - Promotion in the community to support events
 - General legwork
 - Offer hospitality, rides to visiting speakers
- E. Local leaders of organizations outside the core group

WHAT TYPES OF EVENTS CAN I PLAN?

If your team hasn't already come up with plans, here are some general ways that you can be part of our global community to bring peace and A Season for Humane Service to your community.
